Tragedy At The Lodge





Brethren, as most of you know the Lodge suffered a fire early in the morning on Monday, July 8, 2019. Our apologies if some of you had not heard yet. The fire was electrical, some of the old wiring we had not replaced yet, and started in the area of the Treasurer's desk and organ.

The Lodge Room was pretty much destroyed and had the doors to the Preparation Room and Tyler's Room not been closed, those areas would have been destroyed, but they did have smoke and water damage. We were able to save the pictures of the Truman visit, the Past Masters photos and the Worthy Matrons photos, Lodge records and some other items.

Unfortunately, the Masters Chair, where President Harry Truman once sat, was damaged beyond repair. It was decided to use what pieces were salvageable and have pens and key fabs made. These will be sold as a fundraiser to help offset costs for the rebuild., more details to come soon. Several Lodges have reached out to us offering furniture from lodges that have merged with them. We are still in the process of looking at furniture to find the right fit for Beech Grove, a decision should be made within the next few weeks.

The first floor suffered a considerable amount of water and smoke damage. The block walls of the building are in good shape, the roof and joists were damaged enough that the whole roof will be replaced. That should happen by the middle of January. The building is currently gutted, and the Contractor is starting to build the new support walls for the new joists.

The rebuild plans have been approved for the layout and we are getting the Electrical, Lighting, Plumbing and HVAC plans finalized. We will keep you posted on the progress of the rebuild. Until the completion of the rebuild we are meeting at Englewood Lodge #715, located at 6170 E. Southern Ave., Indianapolis.

Tentatively, we are looking at the end of April to the middle of May for completion of the lodge.

In closing, together let's make this lodge great again. Let's show everyone our pride of being a Brother of Beech Grove Lodge #694. I look forward to seeing each and everyone of you at some point throughout the year, whether it be at a dinner, meeting or social event. I promise, if you attend an event, I won't make you commit to anything, just come have dinner sometime.
